Term	Intervention	Cost	Impact
Started Autumn - but carried on all year	Bucket time sessions introduced across the setting to support those children who struggle to access the curriculum Contribution towards staff costs	£2,200	Bucket time sessions are rolled out across the setting - these are targeted and carried out with larger groups. Listening and attention skills have improved for individual children, and they have made progress against their SALT targets.
Autumn	Additional staffing to support transition and new starters - developing PSED skills and wellbeing	£728.18	Children settled quickly and calmly. Additional staffing gave opportunities for smaller group sessions to enable children to explore and name their feelings and navigate the largely room and staff ratio.
Spring	Feather and fur - owls	£348.62	Revisiting the children's learning and giving them the real-life experience to see and touch the owls.
Spring	Incredible eggs - additional experiences for children who were able to observe and follow the hatching and growing of ducks.	£325	To provide a wide range of experiences for all children to support their understanding of life cycles and living things. To give children wider experiences and to add interest to the curriculum, developing the sense of awe and wonder.
Spring	Access to lunch club/ extended services /additional hours in nursery to support particular children and their families. Contribution towards additional costs	£750	Support families with providing additional lunches/sessions in nursery to ensure enhance wellbeing within families, particularly those working with other professionals.
Summer	Usports - providing physical skills and knowledge delivered by professional coaches to support children's active development, gross motor skills and wellbeing as well as an opportunity to be taught by a professional within their field.	£1340	Building children's self-confidence and abilities to follow instructions. Developing gross and fine motor physical skills particularly for the children who do not have gardens. Upskilling staff -with different ways to teach physical skills.
Summer	Interactive theatre	£415	Developing the children's listening and attention skills, whilst giving them the experience to watch and interact with the show.
